- **COVID-19 Public Health Emergency**
  - Board Policies 2800 & 2900 currently remain in force – approved when needed the most for masking and vaccinations
  - March 2022, 2-Year Anniversary
  - Possible new surge with subvariant of Omicron, but mixed results – cases up, but other metrics are not
  - County Health Orders modified and reduced
  - Likely entering “Endemic” phase vs. Pandemic, as COVID-19 Health officials believe virus will not be eradicated



- Options for LACCD Board to Consider:
  1. Keep both policies in place; reconsider in future
  2. Modify one or both
  3. Rescind one or both

## BOARD POLICIES 2800 & 2900



- LACCD Employee Survey Results—All Colleges, Faculty and Staff represented with 2,346 responses
- Recent discussions with LACCD Labor Caucus leaders indicated preference to keep policies in effect, through end of Spring 2022
- Some desire to modify Board Policy 2900 (vaccinations) **for students only** for enrollment considerations





## Recent Survey of LACCD 2,346 Employees regarding Masking (BP 2800)

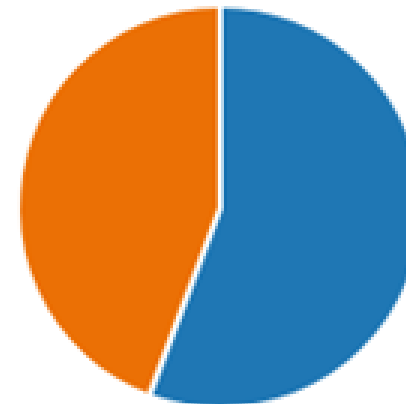
- 56% indicated masking should remain mandatory through end of Spring 2022 term
- 44% indicated masking should be voluntary as soon as possible.

- 62% indicated booster shots should remain mandatory for anyone eligible.
- 38% indicated that booster shots should no longer be mandatory.

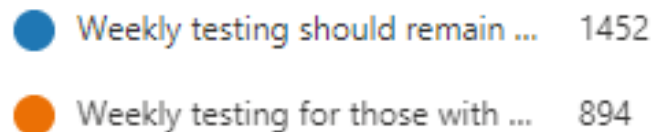


## Recent Survey of LACCD 2,346 Employees regarding Masking and Vaccinations

- 62% indicated weekly testing should remain for those with exemptions, regardless of masking/vaccination policy changes.
  - 38% indicated weekly testing should remain for those with exemptions, only if masking and/or booster shots are no

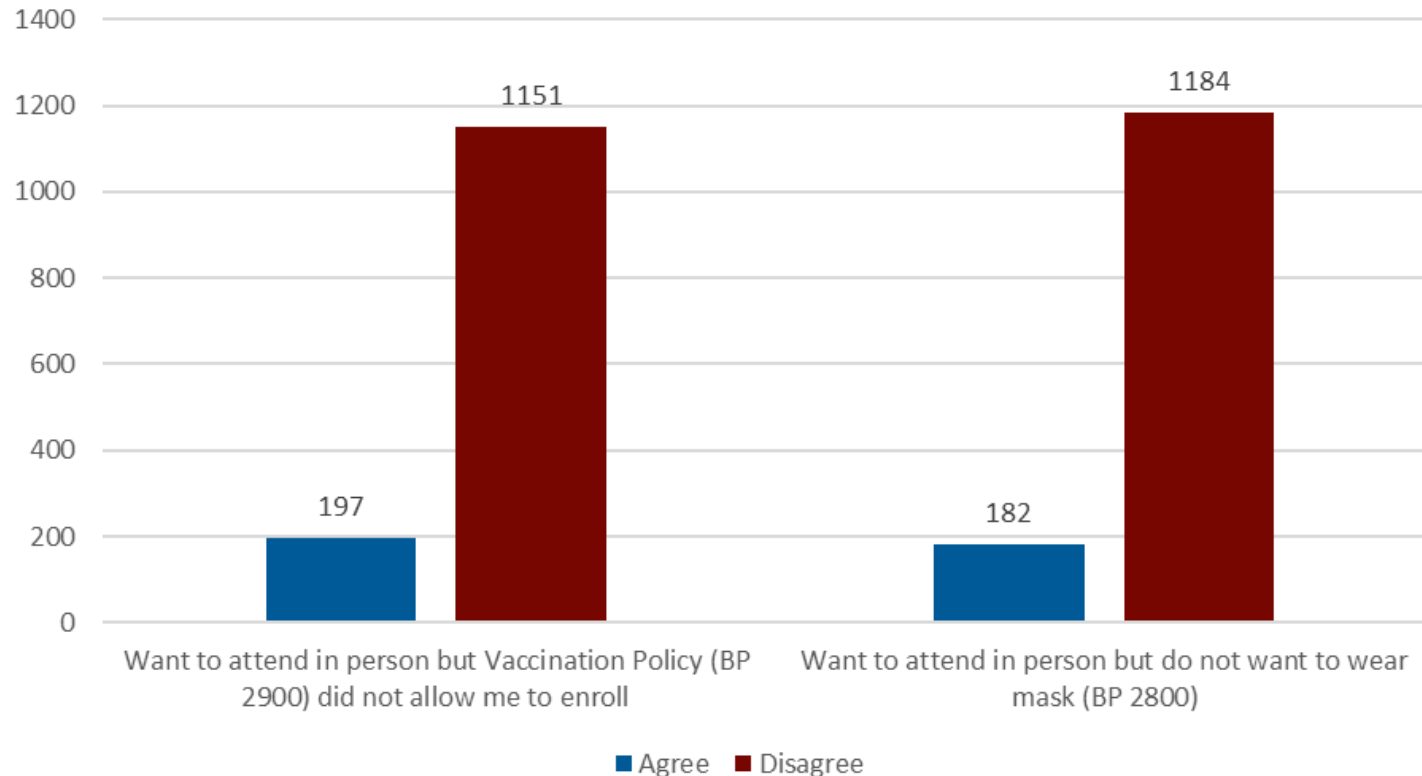


# BOARD POLICIES 2800 & 2900
