COVID-19 / STATISTICS

As of September 2, 2020:

- Nation, state & county remain in declared state of emergency for COVID-19
- 169 Days (5 ½ months)
 activation for District Emergency
 Operations Center & Colleges'
 Incident Command Centers
- Fall 2020 Semester began Aug. 31 with return to limited oncampus instruction for specific classes to support California's essential services workforce infrastructure







COVID-19 / STATISTICS

As of September 2, 2020:

- COVID-19 cases statewide 520,000 positive; 9,500 deaths
- L.A. County stats: 242,521 positive cases, 5,829 deaths (In August: 195,600 positive; 4,750 deaths)
- In LACCD:
 - 133 positive cases (17 case increase from August)
 - 1 fatality (same)
- L.A. County Department of Public Health issued its 16-page "Reopening Protocols for Institutes of Higher Education" that District/Colleges now implementing for access & check-in to colleges, cleaning, communications and case reporting
- District EOC & Colleges in planning stages for Stage 3
 Recovery for increased return to on-campus not yet
 authorized




STAY SAFE CAMPAIGN

SUPPORT FOR OUR STUDENTS DURING COVID-19

- About 4,000 Chromebooks distributed to L.A. College Promise Students in August
- Order placed for additional 14,800 Surface Go devices for other students in need
- Foundation continues distributing food gift cards to students— 500 cards in August
- Special online registration fairs "All for One & One for Fall" held by all colleges together on August 12, 19 & 26







L.A. COLLEGE PROMISE ENROLLMENT RE-OPENS

- Applications for L.A. College Promise Program for Fall 2020 now accepted through September 15.
- More than 400 students already have expressed interest
- District providing expedited service for application processing
- Districtwide messaging, public/media outreach underway









NEXT STEPS

- District EOC & Colleges planning for expanded return to campus—working with LACDPH on timelines, protocols
- Fall 2020 remains primarily in remote environments
- Colleges planning now for Winter, Spring schedules
- Ongoing enrollment marketing planned
- Continue strong advocacy efforts at federal & state levels to benefit District & students
- Strong Fiscal oversight due to state budget & economy
- Continue orders for PPE and other emergency supplies
- Continue activation for response as needed while in declared emergency status
